

How staff can reduce falls by time of day




- Most falls occur between 5-8am and 6-9pm (Shift change)
- Opportunity to coach team on fall trends and reduction strategies
- Ensure flow of information between team members and encourage collaboration

Note: Data includes 500+ fall detections across 25 communities over 400+ unique residents.



Actual Fall Event

- How is your team responding to residents on the ground?
- Does current training address resident dignity?
- Are staff members actively engaged in fall prevention efforts?





3 Most Common Obstacles to Staff Training

- Difficulty in having seasoned care staff with high staff turnover
- Resource and cost limitations that require most trainings to be computer based vs. in-person
- Time restraints and making the time for in-service

The Value of In-Service Training

Effective In-Service Training on Fall Protocol Adherence

- Focus on policy review community specific fall response procedures
- Examine Timing brief 15-minute sessions work well
- 3. Engage the team keep training interactive, promote demonstration of skills and fall scene investigation
- 4. Use real environment resident room, common space, etc.
- 5. Ensure effectiveness ongoing spot checks and in-servicing required to maintain



Training Example



Fall Scene Investigation

What can we learn from a fall?

- Is anything out of place?
- Where is the mobility aid?
- What is the position of the bed?
- What is the resident wearing? Non slip socks, clothing fit?
- Was it dark in the room?
- Was the door propped open?
- Is the closet door open?



Promote active engagement and problem solving with caregivers

Additional Success Stories

- No workers comp claims for 5 months
- 2. Improved staff response, assessment & engagement
 - 69% lower at entry
 - 70% physical eval before transfer
 - 100% uniform compliance
- 3. Resident move in due to SafelyYou
- 4. Enhanced family engagement in fall prevention

Lessons Learned

- Keep the training simple and focus on critical elements, not just steps.
- Find opportunities to reinforce basics. Shift change/huddles.
- Continuously observe the techniques and immediately in-service.
- Recognize and empower those that show proper technique.
- Highlight community success stories and fall reduction




Why focus on falls in dementia care?

- Challenge | Residents with dementia have greater needs
 - Average resident with dementia fall 4 x per year (2 x more than others)
 - 80% of falls are unwitnessed
 - 26% of Alzheimer related hospitalizations are caused by falls
- Current Solutions | Doesn't work in dementia care



On Site Hardware | Designed to be Unobtrusive



POE Camera mounted with raceway and a removeable cover for those that opt out





Al What's become possible?







Artificial intelligence registers this resident is not on the ground. No video is being uploaded.



Artificial intelligence registers this resident is on the ground and the system alerts the care staff while uploading the previous 30min of video.



The care staff check on the resident to assess for severe injuries.



When the resident is stable and comfortable, the care staff reviews the video of the fall to determine how they fell.

caused the resident to go to the ground
